After serving two local churches, I spent almost two decades in denominational leadership for The Wesleyan Church punctuated by two years of teaching at IWU, to which I returned in 1996 and have taught practical ministry courses in the religion division ever since.

Focus: practical ministry courses, worship courses and mentoring future leaders. Student life: chapel speaker; freshman year experience speaker; systematic mentoring of six student leaders per semester; informal alliances with denominational leaders; mentored new faculty; co-founder (with Stephen Lennox) of "Shoe String Tours" a program designed to introduce students to international travel-learning at budget rates; leader of various outdoor activities with students, e.g. backpacking across Scotland, across Colorado, and hiking three years on the Pacific Crest Trail..

(A ¼ time assignment in 1996-1997 was to redesign the IWU Master's degree in Ministry for on-line delivery option along with the present on-site format—the final proposal was not accepted though seven years later the program is now finally going online.)
- IWU Strategic Planning Committee, member (Goal: To design over a one-year period an institutional strategic plan for adoption by all stakeholders including faculty, staff, students, alumni, and the trustees. This committee became an ongoing committee for establishing accountability for the strategic plan and to develop annual goals for the institution. I have continued to serve on this committee.)

- President's Task Force on Ministerial Education, Chair. (Charter: redesign undergraduate ministerial education with a significant service-learning component; produce a comprehensive approach to IWU's undergraduate and graduate theological education and design a potential doctor's degree. The effect of this year-long task force was to produce the current curriculum of ministerial education at IWU requiring seven semesters of local church practicum experience. The plan for the doctor's degree did not happen in 1997 but six years later the University did indeed propose a doctor's degree to NCA.
- <u>Dream of Distinction Task Force</u> (Goal: in line with the strategic plan of the institution, design a ten million dollar program to submit for foundation funding. The grant was successfully funded by Lilly Endowment)
- World-Changer Freshman Course Experience—Peer group leader Coordinator. (Supervised and designed training for upper class peer leaders in a new freshman experience course.)
- <u>Life Calling and Leadership Center Grant Planning Task Force</u>. (Participated in the task force planning for the grant-writing work to be submitted to Lilly Foundation for the Life Calling and Leadership grant. The proposal was funded by the Lily Endowment.)
- <u>Teaching Excellence Award</u>: (Earned the teaching excellence award every year from 1997 until it was discontinued five years later. The teaching excellence award was presented each year to 6-10 professors based on student classroom evaluations of the professors.)
- <u>Faculty Development Committee</u>: (Served as the dean's representative to the Indiana Wesleyan University's Faculty Development Committee 2002-2004 participating in providing for the development of new and existing faculty and processing peer-reviewed rank improvement applications.
- <u>Informal Advisor</u>: Frequently contributing considerable time as an informal advisor and off-therecord confidant to President Jim Barnes, several District superintends and one General Superintendent of The Wesleyan Church along with several division chairs. While it is not a stated duty in my job description, and the effect of such informal advising is not public, it may in fact be the most influential roles I ever have.

<u>1990—1996</u> General Director of Local Church Education, The Wesleyan Church, Indianapolis Focus: renewing and revitalizing the discipleship and Christian Education ministries of 1600 local Wesleyan churches across North America. Service during this period:

- Wesleyan Church alliance with David C. Cook Publishing. (Forged a pioneering alliance between The Wesleyan Church publishing interests and David C. Cook to produce a cooperative line of Wesleyan curriculum for marketing in both the Wesleyan Church and through Cook for successful mass market Methodist uses.)
- <u>Interdenominational alliances</u>. (Developed and maintained close ties with the Free Methodist Church producing numerous cooperative products and programming, including common adoption of the new Wesley Bible Curriculum growing out of the Wesleyan-Cook alliance.)
- Sharpen The Vision Conferences. (Collaborated with three colleagues to conceive, design and lead a denomination-wide conference, rallying the denomination for renewal and common direction which was joined with the Board of General Superintendents and became the most significant quadrennial influence on the denomination of the period.)
- <u>Bible Story Cards Curriculum</u>. (Reinvented and reintroduced an 19th century idea—a two year Bible curriculum with base-ball-sized picture cards as a take-home item, which was an historic financial success sweeping the English and Spanish markets
- <u>Teaching the Bible Conferences</u>. (Conceived, designed and led thirty North American conferences for training more than 7000 local pastors and teachers in developing innovative pedagogy in local church teaching.)

- Wesley Bible Commentary. (Imagined, designed, and managed the editorial production of the Wesley Bible Commentary series, cooperating with the Wesleyan Publishing House for sales and distribution.)
- Speaking and teaching. (Maintained an extensive speaking and lecturing schedule in and outside of the denomination averaging more than 75 engagements a year at district and regional minister's retreats, college campuses, conventions, and local church conferences about evenly split between training-lecturing and preaching. Near the close of this period, gave the Presidential Luncheon address to the Christian Holiness Association that became the central focus of almost all discussions in the holiness movement for the following five years.)
- Guest Lecturer. (Holiness lecturer during this period at Houghton College, Indiana Wesleyan University, Northwest Nazarene College and Wesley Biblical Seminary, and previously at Bartlesville Wesleyan College and United Wesleyan College.)
- General Board of Administration 1980--1996 (Served sixteen years as a full voting member of the Wesleyan Church's General Board of Administration)
- <u>Public Morals and Social Concerns</u>. (Primary writer of the denomination's 1996 statement on social concerns and public morals.)
- <u>Houghton College Board of Trustees</u> (Served through most of this period as a member of the Houghton Trustees and participation on the development and student life subcommittees of the board)
- Adjunct teaching. (Regular teaching through Indiana Wesleyan University's APS/LEAP program in New Testament; Also, designed the course "Discipleship of Men" on male spirituality, and taught it in the IWU Master's program several years before the Christian men's movement emerged.)

Focus: Developing professional, competent well-trained Youth Pastors and Christian Educators for local church work. Service during this period:
